Not only was he an international fly casting champion and world record holder, Green helped develop the graphite rods and modern fly lines that most of us use today.




Mike also reported that the Evergreen Fly Fishing Club has joined Olympic Fly Fishers in pursuing this cause.


"Currently, Ebey Lake is the only lake designated 'fly fishing only' in the County," Mike says. "But it's surrounded by private property and there's no access. We hoped Fish and Wildlife could resolve the problem but there just wasn't a way to monitor access consistently. So we're trying to find a new lake with better access."

Mike has also prepared a letter to send along with the petition and will brief the club on that at our next meeting.

Randy Patterson is a former OFF Club President and a good friend to many of the club members who go back a few years. He now makes his home in Fayetteville, PA. His wife passed recently and he asked us to include this notice in Tightlines.

July 13, 2010 -It is with incredible sadness that I tell you I lost my love, best friend and partner early this morning in the ICU at Chambersburg Hospital. She suffered a stroke about a month ago and was in therapy for recovery. Her spirit and will to make a recovery was so strong and she worked so hard for that on a daily basis in therapy. But the damage must have been too great and she began to

deteriorate as time went by. I moved her from her therapy facility to the ICU at the hospital yesterday and she left me about 4AM today. Both of our kids were with me as the end approached and are with me now. We will have a service in our church here at a date I will announce and a service at Arlington later. Directions to Bill MacDonald's

From Hwy-99 (Pacific Hwy) & 196 SW (SR-524):

Go West on 196th 1.7 mi. 196th becomes Puget Drive as you snake down the hill. Just past Edmonds Realty take the exit just before the main road turns to the left. This is the exit to continue on Puget Drive. Follow Puget Drive to the first road to your left which is Puget Lane. Go to the end of Puget Lane. Bill's is 702 Puget Lane. There's room for about six cars at Bill's. If you continue around the curve on the main road there's a parking lot to your left for St. Peter's Lutheran Church. You can Park there, cross at the crosswalk and walk down.
